This program is offered in cooperation with KCTCS and Western Kentucky University. The program allows students to transfer a completed AAS program in Information Technology to WKU and be accepted towards completion of the BS in Computer Information Technology (CIT) degree. More specifically, the AAS degree will be accepted as a single 'block transfer' (not as a unique set of individual courses. Students may complete any of the several 'options' within the KCTCS IT program (e.g. Web Design, Networking, etc.) The AAS degree will be accepted in-lieu of the majority of the CIT core requirements. Students should note that a block transfer only applies to the completion of the CIT major. KCTCS students must apply to and be accepted into WKU's CIT program. Admission is selective and program capacity is limited. As part of the admissions process, KCTCS students must apply to <u>both</u> WKU and to the CIT program. Admission to one does not guarantee admission to the other. WKU uses a rolling admissions process and accepts applications at any time. The CIT program has specific admission deadlines that must be observed.
